MINUTES:

The minutes from the January 14 meeting were unanimously approved.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

- The audit was completed by Kirk Cornwell on February 25, 2021.
- The dues notice will go out again in the November newsletter.
- A vote was required for \$60 to increase the budget for the Squarespace Email Campaign annual fee. This was unanimously approved.
- Noted: An email vote to increase the budget for car window decals from \$150 to \$200 was unanimously approved on 2/20/21.
- Noted: An email vote for purchase of a Tribute Tree for Dick Hughes was unanimously approved on 2/24/21. The final cost was \$45.90.

MEMBERSHIP:

A volunteer is needed to take over maintenance of Prosser Hollow.
