BUSINESS MEETING: The Annual Meeting took place at an outdoor beach picnic area at Long Pond at Grafton Lakes State Park, with members separated by the CDC guidelines of 6 feet or wearing masks. Following the business meeting, most attendees went on a hike around Shaver Pond and then returned to the Beach area for a picnic of items each had brought.

- Board meetings may be held electronically
- At a general Club meeting, a quorum of 15 members is needed to hold a vote on club business
- Bylaws may be amended electronically or at a Club meeting where quorum is present, if the amendment is presented not less than 10 days before the vote.

MEMBERSHIP: We have 223 members, of which 56 are new this year and 26 new since the pandemic. We have an active website and are on Facebook. 46 people finished the Taconic Crest Trail this year, 16 in one day.

PUBLICITY: New maps have been published that include the Class of 33 Trail and the WRLF Loop Trail. They are selling briskly.

TRAIL WORK: The Club has contributed 400 hours of trail work so far this year.
